CellExchange Contract for USAF vPSC Receives Increase in Funds – Ceiling Raised to \$44M

Cambridge, MA, March 10, 2006 — CellExchange, a systems integrator focusing on business transformation and IT change, today announced an increase to the IDIQ contract ceiling on the USAF vPSC contract from \$29M to \$44M.

The Virtual Personnel Services Center (vPSC) is a key program for the Air Force Department of Personnel (DP) at Randolph AFB in San Antonio, TX. vPSC's objective is to enable Air Force personnel – Military, Civilian, or Contractor – to seamlessly manage and maintain information pertinent to their careers, from in-processing to retirement, while at the same time allowing the Personnel community to modernize and integrate functionality between legacy, stove pipe, and future systems. CellExchange is the prime contractor for the vPSC program and has performed all work to date in support of vPSC mission, including implementing the first of many increments required to support data transfer between legacy personnel systems and future systems.

vPSC implementation has begun with development of the Force Development ToolKit (FDTK) for Officers. "FDTK is the single, central tool that provides members, supervisors, and commanders the ability to communicate on an individual's goals, his/her leadership's developmental assessments, and make recommendations to his/her chain-of-command," says Robert Conley, Project Manager for FDTK at CellExchange. In future spirals, the program will expand to other users and HR domains such as evaluations, recognition, assignments, and training.

vPSC's technical architecture is based on Service Oriented Architecture (SOA) within the GCSS-AF framework. vPSC provides a modernized platform to build Air Force unique HR services not delivered with DIMHRS (Pers/Pay). "vPSC standardizes and improves data quality and availability. Its flexible, open architecture enables future expansion and allows for immediate efforts to deliver initial capability," said Conley. By bringing together disparate systems and overlapping processes, CellExchange is helping create a single access point for Air Force HR activity.

The ceiling increase will accommodate the heightened complexity level required to integrate legacy personnel systems with DIMHRS (Pers/Pay). The period of performance of this contract is not affected.
